I will gingerly try to write this without offending anyone, and believe me, this is not my desire or purpose. A friend of mine, who happens to be pastor, told me his wife thought I must have been saved outside the church. He asked her why she thought so. She responded that I seemed too free.

Go figure!

***John 8-36 "So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed."***

If He has made people free, why do some of them put yokes upon their necks again? People fall back into the bondage of doctrine and rules that they are told they must obey.

If I may sum this up with a single word, LOVE. If you love you fulfill the entire law, and all the teachings of Jesus. If you love God with your entire being and love you neighbor as yourself, then you will do no wrong to either God or mankind. Is this hard?

I love to worship and have with many different denominations that say you must *invite* Jesus into your life to be saved.

***Revelation 3: 20 Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me.***

As Paul said, ***"If I have gifts and lack love, then I have nothing."*** Jesus taught about a Samaritan who helped someone beaten and left for dead. The Samaritan was called a true "neighbor". *Love alone is the sign you have Christ.* He came because of His love for us. He taught us that to lay down your

life for another is real love. It has nothing to do with saying, "Hey man, I love you", but rather getting your hands dirty at times. You may see a homeless person, take them home, clean them up, and feed them. This is the love that the world sees and by it, knows who lives in you.

I fall on my face at times and allow God to pick me up. Being free is so wonderful, for if you are truly free, you give it away. You give your time, money, and yourself.

It is not, however, being "rule" laden. It is not living by OT laws or even the Ten Commandments. It is not being saved by an invitational prayer, baptism at a young age, or receiving the gift of tongues. These are things we seem to do because we cannot deal with the fact God did it all. To be free, you must know that it cost you nothing, the price was paid. I guess its human nature to think we must add to the priceless work done at the cross.

When we were born the first time, we needed to learn all about the world and its' rules. To be "born again" is to let His work be enough.

***In John 13 35 "By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."***

Where is the outward sign that the world may see? So many denominations put their emphasis on things we do and not much upon the freeing affect love has on the individual. Yet it should unite us like super glue. (*Trust me super glue unites, fingers to all kinds of materials*)

I give thanks to God for my salvation coming in a one to one fashion, instead of in a church building. I could have been duped into believing I was saved, when in fact I may have said the right things, done the right stuff, yet never known Jesus.

As far as I can tell, the only outward sign that counts as far as being a radical born-again son or daughter of God is His love flowing through you. The rest is junk. The Bible is a love letter that shows God's long suffering love for us. With Christ in you,

how can it not shine fourth? If it is not in you...then you cling to the things you do. Love cannot be hidden! If we as Christians would allow Jesus to shine in our lives, imagine the light that the world would see!

***Revelations 12 11" And they overcame him because of the blood of the Lamb and because of the word of their testimony, and they did not love their life even when faced with death.***

Wow, love even overcomes the imp, if applied properly - not selfishly, rather selflessly. I hope this gives you something to ponder. Stop being yoked by rules and be free to love!

# The Things We Struggle With



Have you ever caught yourself in a “before” Jesus action? One that you *knew* you would never commit after the conversion of the Holy Spirit took hold. So what do you do?

*For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual {forces} of wickedness in the heavenly {places}.*

**Wrestling:** a) contest between two in which each endeavors to throw the other, and which is decided when the victor is able to hold his opponent down with his hand upon his neck)  
b) the term is transferred to the Christian's struggle with the power of evil

*Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us,*

Again....

*I affirm, brethren, by the boasting in you which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, I die daily.*

I guess my point is that when we struggle, it is not usually against another where we do hand to hand combat, but rather it is

internal; we fall back into a behavior that robs us of our peace. We are on a journey with Jesus and like children; we fall and scrape our knees at times. Paul says continue even when we find our hearts wandering to a pre Jesus state.

To die daily is an interesting concept here for me. How can we do this? If we were renewed by God's mercy, then to die a third time would be ludicrous. I take this to mean that we simply are giving every day to God's control, instead of to our own.

Whether the struggle is with an addiction, a behavior, or anything not glorifying God, it is a spiritual fight. I am not crazy about the terms demonic or satanic, but this struggle does come from the ruler of this rock, and that is the imp.

So not to be too long winded, let me try to wrap this up by saying this. *The more time we give to God, the less room in our lives we have for such things to rob us of the peace.*

***{We are} destroying speculations and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and {we are} taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ,***

Again let me state that in spending more time with our Lord Jesus, the less our thoughts seek the things of the flesh. You occupy a finite space. You have two choices of what to fill that space with, one good, one not. It is your choice what you fill that space with.

***"You shall therefore impress these words of mine on your heart and on your soul; and you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontals on your forehead.***

It is not always the lack of time we spend with God that causes these struggles, for at times when we are closest to Him, the struggles seem worse. The remedy is simplistic...

***Therefore let us draw near with confidence to the throne of grace, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.***

When we struggle and if we fall, call out to Him - give God control over the situation. For even in the rooms full of utter moral decay, He is there, whether the room is literal, or figurative. I would suggest that at the time the struggle begins, we call on Jesus and give Him the situation.

***Calling on His name, the Lord knows how to rescue the godly  
from temptation,***

Struggles stink, but there are part of the journey. If you notice, these battles will grow you. Take comfort in knowing, if you were not His, then you would be of no use to the imp!

# When Floods Come



We have all heard of the great flood in the days of Noah and the tsunami of Southeast Asia that killed thousands.

***"Behold, I, even I am bringing the flood of water upon the earth, to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life, from under heaven; everything that is on the earth shall perish.***

***And the serpent poured water like a river out of his mouth after the woman, so that he might cause her to be swept away with the flood.***

Theses two verses, the first in Genesis and the other in Revelations speak of a flood and a flood yet to come. We can try to prepare for the literal flood, for we can see the signs of impending doom. The latter the one is spiritual and we are unable to see this as clearly.

I write this piece because I have a friend who encountered a flood that took his home from him. More importantly, it made him feel helpless. I know this feeling. I felt helpless when my family split up within a year of Jesus entering my life. This spiritual flood was devastating. Hopelessness swept over me like a dam breaking and lasted for what seemed like, years.

I can only imagine the loss of material things to water or fire. I know the hopeless feeling of loss. What, if anything, can we obtain in strength and/or learning from such a catastrophe? I know in my situation, when it seemed all was lost, I realized God was the only thing that mattered; He as the only thing left I could cling to.

It becomes so clear that the things you clung to at times clouded your view of God. Job lost it all and became angry. Most his friends were not to helpful, but God was still close to Job.

It is easy to say, *“Search for the silver lining in the midst of a storm or the rainbow God placed in the clouds”*.

Clichés are not what is needed in times of loss and pain. Comfort and understanding, help and aid are what are needed. God will show the lesson; what is to be learned from the pain. Our job is to be there as an extension of God’s love to those in need.

*Father, I know You to be sovereign in all and Your purpose may not always be evident. Lord, let us be a stronghold for those hurting. We know You do not cause all things, but You knew it would happen before it did. Let us all find comfort in Your love in times like these and keep our focus upon You. Amen*

# Count It All Joy



First, let me say that this is not intended to be aimed at anyone. I have just noticed the lack of joy in the face of God's children.

***Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials,***

***Not that I complain of want; for I have learned, in whatever state I am, to be content.***

***I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need.***

Don't the title and the first verse pretty much say it all? We as Christians are called to another level through Christ; one that is filled with amazing joy and peace. Not by our own power, but through God's power, in the form of the Holy Spirit.

So, are you lacking peace and joy? If so, may I ask you to examine the reasons you aren't. Sometimes it may be because God is trying to move you, but more often, it is because your focus is on the wrong thing, "self".

Is your peace dependant upon the things around you, the relationships you have, or is it dependant upon the relationship with Jesus?

***"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful.***

What do these words of Jesus mean to you? Do you think He gave it to some or all who are His? I believe it is for all of us.

Is your focus is upon God and His power that dwells in you? If so, do you give yourself away to be an imitator of Jesus? Are you loving God with your entire being and loving your neighbor as yourself?

***Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves;***

I take this to mean our heart is right when we empty ourselves to lift up another. Can you find peace in this, or does your peace come from things that are done for you? Is your eye upon God or in the mirror?

My peace comes from above and I love being able to hear the laughter of another, knowing joy is coming from them. Joy comes from above not from what you see. So, I ask you once again, do you not have peace because you are being selfish? Are you relying on what you can get through your own power? On the other hand, does your peace come from giving yourself away? Not being mindful of you, in other words, selfless? I ask you search for His truth, for He left you His peace and God never lies! Paul got it right:

***I can do all things through Him who strengthens me.***

And if you have trouble grasping this, recall this,

***But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us.***

***For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.***

If this does not bring you peace, then do an inventory of your heart. Count it all joy and the key word is **all**. May you find the

peace He longs for you to have and joy that draws the world to seek Him.

# Hanging On



Some days are hard and feeling the love that captivated our hearts is hard. We have the things in life that non-believers have and they can get us cast upon jagged rocks if we allow them to. Situations and emotions can be used to put a wedge between us and God. Sometimes the problem or situation becomes our "god".

Our faith will be tested by many things - some of them by people close to us. We catch ourselves asking why have You allowed this to happen to me or why has this happened to someone I love? Job is our best example:

***Job 2:1- 6: Again there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan also came among them to present himself before the LORD.***

***The LORD said to Satan, "Where have you come from?" Then Satan answered the LORD and said, "From roaming about on the earth and walking around on it."***

***The LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered My servant Job? For there is no one like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man fearing God and turning away from evil. And he still holds fast his integrity, although you incited Me against him to ruin him without cause."***

***Satan answered the LORD and said, "Skin for skin! Yes, all that a man has he will give for his life.

***So the LORD said to Satan, "Behold, he is in your power, only spare his life."***

Alternatively, we can look at Psalms 139 verse 4

God knows all, even before there was breath in us. The imp has no power, but that we give him, for even he needs God's permission to come against us. Remember the three who were tossed into the furnace? Or Daniel when he was locked in with the lions? Even Moses had his turmoil.

Even though I felt flattened, just like a child who has messed up, it is all good, because my Father still loves me.

*Thank You Father and give me the desire to change this day - to become more like Jesus, Amen*

# A Reflection of Me

# When We Walk In The Law



*Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace.*

*For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles in one {point,} he has become guilty of all.*

This is frightening to me that anyone would try to recreate the law as a way to sanctification.

## **Sanctification**

1. The act of making holy. In an evangelical sense, the act of God's grace by which the affections of men are purified or alienated from sin and the world, and exalted to a supreme love to God.
2. The act of consecrating or of setting apart for a sacred purpose; consecration.

As you can see below justification is not even keeping the law, but rather the evidence after faith, that the Holy Spirit is cleaning you, and making you into a new creation.

## **Justification**

- 2 the act or an instance of justifying : vindication b: something that justifies
3. the process or result of justifying lines of text

How many do you know that would have you do something in order to show yourself worthy? The rules we engage in when we are saved are just a “pride thing” we must get past. Why is it that we must feel that we had anything to do with our salvation? It takes humility to confess sin to our Father, and that same

humility to admit we could do nothing to get to Heaven on our own.

We all take a certain pride in our work or home life, but when it comes to God, we can take no credit. Now let me take this a step further, suppose we give God all the credit for our home life and our ability to perform at work? Then we have the correct attitude, giving all honor and praise to Him that saved us! Grace is free, don't mess it up, for as the opening line states....

***Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace.***

Search your heart for the motive when you seek to do a good deed, for God already knows the motive. May it all be for His glory.

***And they \*came to Bethsaida. And they \*brought a blind man to Jesus and \*implored Him to touch him. One time we are told that Jesus was in His hometown and because of their lack of faith, He did few miracles. Is this to mean that He could not do what He chose? No, but rather, He would not act against a person's will, so few miracles were done.

I feel (*Please, do not take my word for it, Check the Bible.*) it is to show us the kind of blindness we have as adults. This man could see at one time. As children, we were closer to God in many of ways. Then the world, for whatever reason, blinds us to Him and we go astray. When we seek His touch, He does not withhold it. On the contrary, He wants to reclaim the lost! His first touch brings back our sight as we search for Him. But, if we are not careful, we may see things twisted; not as they actually are.

Let me try this analogy, when we hear of Jesus we may think we know about Him, but it is not until we see Him for who He is that we can truly accept Him, and have our sight restored. To

gain sight is a miracle in itself, but to gain life in Jesus is nothing short of miraculous.

Have you been touched by our loving Savior Jesus, but refuse to come to Him? Ask for the touch that gives sight to see Him for who He is and what He has done. You will not want the world any longer, but will long to draw close to Jesus. In that you will find you have it all, including your sight to see what matters.

# To Sow What?



## **Talent:**

- 1) the scale of a balance, a balance, a pair of scales
- 2) that which is weighed, a talent
  - a) a weight varying in different places and times
  - b) a sum of money weighing a talent and varying in different states and according to the changes in the laws regulating currency
- 1) the Attic talent was equal to 60 Attic minae or 6000 drachmae

***To one he gave five talents, to another, two, and to another, one, each according to his own ability; and he went on his journey.***

We all know the parable of the talents. Let me see if I can explain the double meaning here....

them and some preachers expound upon this. Following God's ministry, it will bring rewards, but they are the eternal kind.

I like the above parable and explanation of what a talent is. Remember the parable, the king came back and asked what was done with my money? Two out of three did what was right and increased what had been given to them. But the last servant buried the money and earned nothing for his master. This is what happens when we sow money as seed expecting a windfall. The only thing this kind of sowing does, is irritate God.

A final thought, God does not need money - He owns it all. Give it away if you have a surplus, and then again give *you* away to those in need. In this God is pleased.

# Who's Eyes?



Whose eyes do we use to see the world - even fellow Christians? We are a judgmental people and with no good reason to be. I do believe the very flaws we tend to pick out in others are the ones in ourselves we hate the most. We need to use His words as a micro blade upon ourselves. Do you not believe this verse?

***For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.***

As Jesus taught, we should be allowing His word to change us and allow the Holy Spirit to do its' job. I really love this verse, but we never seem to apply it.

***"Or how can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me take out the speck that is in your eye,' when you yourself do not see the log that is in your own eye? healing by the one Spirit, and to another the effecting of  
miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the  
distinguishing of spirits, to another {various} kinds of tongues,  
and to another the interpretation of tongues.*

(Not to be confused with the fruit of the Spirit)

*But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness,  
goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such  
things there is no law.*

We tend to place a great deal of value on the outward signs of the gifts, i.e. tongues, healing, in some cases a circus atmosphere takes place. Jesus never operated this way, in fact when He healed, He instructed people not to tell. The Holy Spirit is a wonderful comfort, guide and most interwoven part of God to us.

I recall the day I came to Jesus and all the wonderful changes He performed in me. In fact, I visited many churches trying to find more of God. I thought that a church would have the right formula for what I was seeking. I went to one where tongues were the sign you were truly saved. I did not have the gift, so I sought it with all my heart. I would like to see (*in my perfect world*), His children go to church and after 6 months are ready to move out and start a

group on their own. We are light and salt. Light scatters darkness and salt cures, preserves and adds flavor.

# Trust



Do we actually trust God in all? The reason I ask is that I have noticed Christians who hold on to past hurts and troubles. We should lay it all down at His feet. Let go, so that He can fix the brokenness in you.

Another word picture....

A little boy got a new toy car and as little boys are want to do, he broke it. He ran to his father crying for him to fix his toy. The father said he would, but the little boy would not open his hand and give the car to his father. The boy continued to cry for his father to fix his toy, all the while holding it fast in his fist. Finally, his father explained that unless he opened his hand and let him have the toy, he would not be able to repair it. Finally letting the toy car go, the little boy gave the toy to his father and he repaired it.

As with us, we want a situation fixed and we run to God with it, yet we keep a hand upon it. Until we let it go completely, God cannot fix the problem. So I ask you, do you trust God to fix the things in your life, or do you keep a hand on it?

# The Change



If you spend anytime on a computer you have run into a dialog box that requires an action after you download a program or changed a setting on your computer. I use this example because that is what the love of Jesus and the implantation of the Holy Spirit set out to do. It installs a new program; changes your settings. You change from the old self to a new creation.

When you are born again, the change in your life can take three distinct turns. You can just hit the okay button, the program is installed, but no real change has taken affect. You may choose the cancel button, and call the deal off. Or, you hit the *apply* button and the Holy Spirit changes you life radically.

This is a wonderful thing and I hope that you are aware of the revelation He gives you. For change to take place, you must allow the Holy Spirit to hit the apply button. It is not something we do, but it is all about what He is doing in you. We just need to accept the glorious change taking place in us, for it is wonderful to be transformed into a being in communion with God.

Just as your computer will not operate under the new program without it being applied, neither will you operate any differently if you do not allow the Holy Spirit to change you. I love the saying, "The mind can not change the heart, but the heart can change the mind".

***For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ; who will transform (change) the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His glory, by the exertion of the power that He has even to subject all things to Himself.***

# Faith



We all know about faith and what Jesus said about it:

***And Jesus said to him, " 'If You can?' All things are possible to him who believes. "***

Just imagine if we actually believed this! I bring this up because, as you know, the mind is a powerful thing. We need to exercise our faith. As with any muscle, the more we use it, the stronger it gets. So the next time you have gloom and doom in your life, remember Jesus said,

"If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.***

Then trust the Spirit. So please be careful not to step where you should not go, for your brother will accept, but one who is not of God, these words of correction will fall to the ground.

We are however, instructed to carry one another's burdens,

***Brethren, even if anyone is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; {each one} looking to yourself, so that you too will not be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ.***

***And in all, consider it out of love; Above all, keep fervent in your love for one another, because love covers a multitude of sins.***

On another subject of witnessing, we can cross lines and offend others. I remember when Christians would try to convince me I was going to Hades because of the sin in my life. They never once told me that God loved me. I was not willing to listen to those who themselves would say one thing and act another way. It was like a Spanish-speaking person trying to reach me and I only spoke Russian.

In fact, it was not until the Holy Spirit opened my heart and after God wooed me into His presence that I began to understand. It was not a person, but God Himself who called me from darkness to the light. I hear individuals calling gay people sinners, preaching their message without love, using condemnation to get them to turn from their sin. You will never reach anyone while trying to use your bible to browbeat someone into accepting Jesus and your way of thinking.

The Bible is a two edged sword, and if it is not cutting you to the bone, for you to change, you will never convince any other that the word is real. I will end with this,

***In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. So faith {comes} from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ.***

If you have it in you to witness for Jesus, then live your life as He commanded you, for in this, they will see Him.

# What is Your Faith In?



I know that seems a strange question, but I am being serious with you. How strong would your faith be if you did not have your Bible, praise and worship music or the church? Would you feel apart from God, or would your faith grow stronger?

I ask because in different parts of the world, they do not have the things we cling to. Do you put your faith in God alone, or the *things* that make you feel good? ***Now the sons of Reuben, Israel's firstborn, their genealogical registration by their families, by their fathers' households, according to the number of names, head by head, every male***

*from twenty years old and upward, whoever {was able to} go  
out to war,*

Think about it, for I believe that God knew (since He created us), that there is an age that we become accountable. Until that age, we do not have the learning or wisdom to understand what it is to accept Christ and serve Him.

So I would teach your children as instructed by God, at the rising, walking along the road and at the lying down at night, for if we train a child the way they should go....they will not depart from it and that is a promise of God's, not of man.

# Is The Church To Be Political?

While Christians know that the only way to obtain salvation is through Jesus Christ, we do not have the right to force our beliefs onto others.

Corporal prayer in schools is a hot topic for Christians. No one has banned your child from bowing his/her head and saying a silent prayer to God. No one banned your child from bringing his/her bible to read during lunch or study hall. Your child is only banned from forcing his/her beliefs onto other students... don't you want the beliefs of others different than your own also banned from forcing their beliefs onto your child?

Corporal prayer would have to take into consideration, not just Christian beliefs, but all other religious beliefs as well. Would you really want your child to be forced to pray to Mohammad or Buddha as part of putting prayer back in schools? How could we justify forcing the children of other faiths to pray to a God they don't recognize?

The Ten Commandments placed in public places is another hot topic for discussion and again, for us to force upon those who are not walking in the spirit to bow down to something they don't know or understand is just plain wrong. *God said He would write these things upon the flesh of our hearts, did He miss yours?*

Our walk with God in this life makes us aliens here, so why do we try so hard to bend others to our rules and way of thinking. Sharing your faith does not mean forcing your beliefs on others. Just as we are free to believe in our God, so we must accept that not everyone in this "Christian" country are going to value and share the same beliefs.

# Love



The word “love” is used over three hundred times in the Bible and is a basic tenet of the Christian faith.

***"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.***

***"But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,***

***"The second is like it, 'you shall love your neighbor as yourself.'***

***and you shall love the lord your god with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.***

***But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.***

***Love is patient, love is kind {and} is not jealous; love does not brag {and} is not arrogant,***

To love, as we know it, is for the most part, selfish; it is given for what we expect in return. This is not the love of God, which He instilled in us. Love is a verb. It is an action, not just a feeling, for we are instructed to love those we want to detest. If you know the Bible, you know that the love spoken of cannot be the worldly and that the greatest love is giving one's life for another, as Jesus gave His life for us. It is selfless and not selfish.

As we empty ourselves for others, God is constantly restoring that love. Imagine if you will, a stream of water flowing from a pristine spring. If you stop the flow, it becomes stagnant, but

when free and flowing, stays pure. Love is not something based upon conditions, but is always giving and unconditional.

I know you could see yourself laying your life down for your child, or significant other, but how about for a complete stranger. Remember the story of the Good Samaritan? How a Samaritan man came to the aid of a stranger when others passed him by? Jesus said this man was the “good neighbor”.

# Forgiveness



***"For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.***

***"But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions.***

***Then Peter came and said to Him, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me and I forgive him? Up to seven times?"***

***Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven."***

Forgiveness seems to be one of those things we want to place conditions on. We will forgive if the other person(s) says they are sorry or change in some way to please us.

With God, forgiveness is not intangible, but rather one of His commandments. I will be the first to say that salvation does not hinge on our forgiving others, but to forgive in essence means to allow the Holy Spirit to clean and repair the hurt that holds you in to the past. Forgiveness is a supernatural work done by God. But we must be willing to allow Him to heal and repair us. We simply cannot enjoy the freedom that Christ promises if we hold on to our hurt and anger.

***Only those whose trespasses have been forgiven by God can forgive others. We are to have a spirit of forgiveness."....and all spiritual gifts come from God.***

I was forty years old when I accepted Christ as my Savior. The night Jesus became my king, the peace that flowed into me was incredible. Knowing that even with all I had done to this point in my life, God still loved me was overwhelming. I cried and cried

and it was at that moment that I was able to let go of all that had controlled me.

All my life I had been denying God and coming against those who believed. Bitterness and anger had been my life. I had held my father in contempt for many years and had made sure I was nothing like him.

I had never understood being born again until He gave me a new birth. His forgiveness flowed through me, along with His mighty power and amazing grace. Like a wall of water, the dam burst and the floodgates opened. All the bitterness and anger left me. I was not only forgiven, I was able to forgive and made peace with my father. I was free.

*Father, by Your awesome grace, I am whole today. You chose to spare my life. Continue to allow me to be a reflection of You.  
May I continue to Glorify Your Name. Amen.*

# The Door



Someone asked that I add a page on the way of salvation, so this is my attempt to put what He has shown me into words.

First I must say that there is only one way to enter His kingdom, and that is through Jesus alone, for He was the sacrifice for our sin, and as He said,

***"I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me.***

***Psalm 139:1- 24:***

***O LORD, You have searched me and known {me.}***

***You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You understand my thought from afar.***

***You scrutinize my path and my lying down, And are intimately acquainted with all my ways.***

***Even before there is a word on my tongue, Behold, O LORD, You know it all.***

***You have enclosed me behind and before, And laid Your hand upon me.***

*{Such} knowledge is too wonderful for me; It is {too} high, I  
cannot attain to it.*

*Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from  
Your presence?*

*If I ascend to heaven, You are there; If I make my bed in  
Sheol, behold, You are there.*

*If I take the wings of the dawn, If I dwell in the remotest part  
of the sea,*

*Even there Your hand will lead me, And Your right hand will  
lay hold of me.*

*If I say, "Surely the darkness will overwhelm me, And the light  
around me will be night,"*

*Even the darkness is not dark to You, And the night is as bright  
as the day. Darkness and light are alike {to You.}*

*For You formed my inward parts; You wove me in my mother's  
womb.*

*I will give thanks to You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully  
made; Wonderful are Your works, And my soul knows it very  
well.*

*My frame was not hidden from You, When I was made in  
secret, {And} skillfully wrought in the depths of the earth;*

*Your eyes have seen my unformed substance; And in Your  
book were all written The days that were ordained {for me,}  
When as yet there was not one of them.*

*How precious also are Your thoughts to me, O God! How vast  
is the sum of them!*

*If I should count them, they would outnumber the sand. When  
I awake, I am still with You.*

Remember Job...

*So the LORD said to Satan, "Behold, he is in your power, only  
spare his life."*

As you can see, even the imp needs permission to do anything to you. I know that we all are angered or depressed by circumstances, but isn't it comforting to know God is there? God uses the things that happen in our lives to glorify, to grow, and to correct us. He always has our best interests in mind.

So stand firm on the fact that the peace, which comes from God, is not dependant on the circumstances around you, but on the One in you. Paul said it best,

***And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.***

# The Spirit



Paul was speaking to a young and emerging church when he, along with Peter, James, John, and Jude wrote the Epistles. They carried the gospel of a crucified, risen Jesus giving instruction to those seeking God. John wrote that we would have no need for a teacher, for the Spirit would teach us. God said He would write His law on the flesh of our hearts. If this is true, why is it so hard to grasp the truth? Rich Mullins did a song called “*Hard to Get*”. The last verse says...

*I can't see how You're leading me unless  
You've led me here  
Where I'm lost enough to let myself be led  
And so You've been here all along I guess  
It's just Your ways and You are just plain hard to get.*

It seems he was having a trust or faith issue such as we all go through from time to time. Trusting a loving, caring God and seeking the will of Jesus is sometimes hard to “get”. Having faith, which in itself is a gift given, will allow you to always walk in freedom and build the life He wants for you. When we are His, He will lead and guide your every step.

# Unity of the Body



***I in them and You in Me, that they may be perfected in unity,  
so that the world may know that You sent Me, and loved them,  
even as You have loved Me.***

This line is from a prayer of Jesus in the gospel of John where he asks His Father to protect the disciples and keep them unified by their love for each other and for Him after He is gone. We know that the Father never denied Jesus anything he asked.

The only thing one can assume by our lack of unity now is our will supersedes His prayer for us. Psalm 133 is another example of this unity and the blessing it carries.

***Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brothers to dwell  
together in unity!***

***It is like the precious oil upon the head, coming down upon the  
beard, {Even} Aaron's beard, Coming down upon the edge of  
his robes.***

***It is like the dew of Hermon Coming down upon the mountains  
of Zion; for there the LORD commanded the blessing--life  
forever.***

So imagine if you would, how different life could be for believers if we would allow this love from God to work in us!

The bond, this unity, comes from none other than Jesus. Yet, we keep trying to find that perfect way on our own; through denominations and doctrines that sometimes separate, rather than unite.

When I try to imagine the disciples that walked with Jesus; how they went without shelter, sometimes not knowing where their

next meal was coming from; leaving everything to follow Jesus, I am amazed. What love – what faith!

Then I think about the church as it was established in Acts. How they met daily, shared their meals; meeting each need as it occurred, their love for each other - talk about being a light to the world! The love they had affected not only them, but day-by-day numbers were added to the body. Salvation was contagious! If such a group would arise today, I am sure it would be labeled a cult. It would resemble a commune of the hippie days and the established church would most certainly not understand it.

Our failure as a body comes from being complacent and enjoying worldly things to a fault. They excuse themselves by saying the things I need, not seeing, or maybe not wanting to see, that it is a desire...not a need. To live as He asked us to, to follow Him as a servant, means to lift others before self.

*Father, as I seek Your will for my life, to follow after the ways You set before us, let me not loose sight of those whom You came for. Engage us to do Your will, for we know that splintered we make no great light, but as a unified body we can burn bright so that Your glory can been seen. We know You always answered the prayers of Jesus. Let us obey His word and become this perfected union in love to reach the distressed. In the glory of His name, Jesus, we come and say, Amen.*

# The Greatest Gift



How a loving God could pursue a being such as me that denied Him and would deny His existence at every opportunity, is proof of how amazing is His love for us. I went to church as child, but it was of no value to me. I understood little of what was preached. My baptism at age six was meaningless also. I was confirmed in the Lutheran church and became a church member. All meaningless, it just was not real to me.

I recall a man I worked with at the age of 18, trying to tell me about God. I rejected him and God. He so wanted to share his knowledge of God and his salvation, that my denial brought him to tears. I had a bad relationship with my father and held him in contempt. I felt completely justified by my attitude.

It was the week of Christmas and I was struggling financially, trying to pay bills and afford Christmas for my children. Here I was at 40 years of age, having a real financial struggle and to top it off, I had received a letter from my father that had driven me nuts and filled me with rage. A rage mostly aimed at me and my perceived failure as a father in not being able to provide the type of Christmas I wanted to give my children.

In the past, I had purchased lottery tickets, winning \$500.00 twice. So, with the hope of salvaging Christmas, I purchased another. When I did not win, I became enraged. I cursed God while showering in preparation for work, blaming Him for everything that was wrong in my life. Suddenly, I saw a reptilian looking creature with a black left eye that seemed to pierce my soul. In a voice of pure evil it stated, "You're mine." At that moment, through my terror, I felt a touch on my shoulder and a peace I had never known flowed through me. A soft voice said, "You are not his yet." Crying like a baby as I was leaving for work, I asked my wife if we could go to church Christmas Eve, which we did.

After the first of the year, I bought a cheap Bible and read it in three months time. I was like a dry sponge and I soaked up His word with great anticipation and joy. When I came to this passage, I wept:

***Deuteronomy 4:29-31 "But from there you will seek the LORD your God, and you will find {Him} if you search for Him with all your heart and all your soul.***

***When you are in distress and all these things have come upon you, in the latter days you will return to the LORD your God and listen to His voice.***

***For the LORD your God is a compassionate God; He will not fail you nor destroy you nor forget the covenant with your fathers which He swore to them."***

His grace and mercy truly is amazing! At the time I cursed Him, he could have easily let my life be taken, yet He chose to give me a new life.

My life changed dramatically! I forgave my father and all rage, all anger, subsided. I have never looked back! I am what I am today because He saved me; not for what I was, but because He loved me and had a special plan in mind for me.

I give all honor and glory to God for the person He is making me to be. I have even shared my faith with my father. To my sorrow, he remains an agnostic, but I pray for him. More importantly, he knows I have forgiven him.

When I first became a Christian, I shared my experience with everyone I knew. Some thought I was nuts, (one friend accused me of having a "poor man's breakdown". Others were moved enough to renew their faith.

*Thank You Father, for You are beyond comprehension. You alone save us not only from "self", but separation from Your endless love. I give praise, honor, and glory to You for the kindness You showed me. All I have to offer is my life. may it be*

*glorifying to You and may Your great love be reflected in me, in  
Jesus name, Amen.*

# When God Speaks



Ever hear the small quiet gnawing in your soul telling you to do something? When you read the Bible does something inside feel prompted to change? Or how about listening to a praise and worship song that brings you to tears?

That is God speaking to you through the Holy Spirit. He longs for your fellowship and will go through great lengths to get you to listen. Sometimes, when we hear His voice, we try to ignore it; it does not fall into line with what we want to do, but if we are in Him, we will eventually cave to His will.

# When we Fall



Ever find yourself in a place where you feel as though you are disconnected from God? You did something that you know is sin and you are self-tormented to the point of feeling like God has left you?

I think we have all been in that place and it is hard to crawl back to the place of security. Sometimes it is as though it is uphill; we have lost our peace and fellowship. Let me say this is not an excuse to mess up, but it is the truth that we are all going to fail at some point in our walk. Whether it is the old self lifting its ugly head, or something that comes in our lives that may trip us up, we all fall short at certain times in our lives. Peter did when he denied Jesus three times and Moses ran from God for forty years. Elijah after being used by God in a great way ran and hid. Paul wrote about doing the things he hated, yet longed to do what was right. David was another prime example of a man who loved God. God called him a man after His heart, yet like us, he stumbled.

There are two things to let us know our fellowship is broken. The Holy Spirit convicting us is the first and the second is condemnation, which is from the imp. We need to recognize the difference. For the one makes us log to be right with God and the other tells us we can never be right with God.

Jesus was the only perfect one, a holy offering for our shortcomings and our sin. When we stumble and fall, His forgiveness flows and we can always run to Him and be cleansed.

***But if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.***

All means *all*. He was on the earth a bit over 2000 years ago and when He offered Himself, it was for the past, (before we came to Him) the present (the sin we may commit today) and the future (the sin we have yet to do). If we allow the condemnation to come at us, we are driven from the peace He so graciously gave us and we believe the prince of lies. There is no condemnation in Christ Jesus.

***Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.***

The conviction we feel when we mess up comes from the Holy Spirit. It tells us we can overcome and that Jesus wants us to fellowship with Him. I guess the best thing to say is just this: *Learn the difference between condemnation and conviction!* Rebuke the condemnation, for it will cripple you in your walk. I heard a song whose words ring true. It was about a man who saw monks living in a monastery. The man asked a monk one day what was different about them. The monks reply, “When we fall down, we get up and keep on walking”.

Forgiveness is a promise from God. The only condition is that we believe in His son, Jesus. We do not need to wait until we have done something that makes us feel that we are worthy; in that, we are denying the power of Jesus. Get up and keep walking. Believe in what He did, does, and will always do – forgive.

***For sin shall not be master over you, for you are not under law but under grace. What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? May it never be!***

When you fall, get up! He will be right there to once again guide you and bring you close. Stay blessed in His promises, *all of them!* Forgiveness is a promise and God cannot go against His word, EVER.

# Proof of God



If your surroundings do not convince you of the existence of God, then I am not sure this will either, but please allow me to go on. When I was 15 years old, I worked at a pizza place in the evenings. Walking home from work about 1:00 am, one weekend night, I experienced my first encounter with God.

I lived about five miles from work and the walk normally took about 30 minutes. For some reason I decided to confront God. Aloud I told God, "If you are real, show Yourself to me". As I got closer to home, thoughts were racing through my mind and I was not paying too much attention to my surroundings. I approached a shortcut through a wooded area, but because it was so late, I decided stay on the lighted path of the sidewalk.

From across the street, (it was a four lane road, with a grass median), came a call from a man with long hair asking, "Do you want someone to walk with?" I was startled and afraid. I was close to the street I lived on and I replied, "I'm turning here". I began to run and looked back. There was no one there. I did not see where this man could have come from or where he could have gone so quickly.

When I was safely home, I quickly forgot the incident. In 1997, some 35 years after this had happened, I recalled the incident and realized that God had begun calling me even before that had happened!

God began to call when I was attending a confirmation class. The pastor had me stand on a table with my back to him, then asked me to fall backwards, which I did without a second thought. He asked why I had and I replied that I trusted him. After all, he was a pastor and would not hurt me or let me be hurt. He then said that it was this kind of blind faith we need to

be accepted by God. At the age of 12 or 13, I was not buying it, but, in the back of my mind, it stuck with me.

After I accept Christ as my Savior, I wonder if it was an angel or Jesus himself who answered my challenge that night more than 25 years earlier. Maybe it was the earlier experience of trusting so completely that I willingly fell into someone arms that He uses to remind me of His unfailing love.

Is this proof of God? Honestly, I just do not know, but I am convinced in my own mind that He answered when I asked Him to show Himself in a tangible way. I love the story about leaving the 99 to go after the one. That was me. Lost and stubborn until the night when His love reached through my darkness. Showing me that He had been there walking beside me all along.

# The Sabbath



*By the seventh day God completed His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made.*

*"Six days you shall gather it, but on the seventh day, {the} Sabbath, there will be none." "See, the LORD has given you the Sabbath; therefore He gives you bread for two days on the sixth day. Remain every man in his place; let no man go out of his place on the seventh day."*

*So that by this we were given a day to rest from our work, and even to make such a day holy as set apart unto God.*

So why do we have such contention about the Sabbath and what day of the week it should be observed? One group insists it be observed on Saturday and curses the group who observe the Sabbath on Sunday.

*And he said unto them, that the Son of Man is Lord also of the sabbath.*

*And the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because that Jesus had healed on the sabbath day, and said unto the people, There are six days in which men ought to work: in them therefore come and be healed, and not on the sabbath day.*

*The Lord then answered him, and said, [Thou] hypocrite, doth not each one of you on the sabbath loose his ox or [his] ass from the stall, and lead [him] away to watering?*

***And ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan hath bound, lo, these eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the sabbath day?***

***"Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfill.***

When we look at what the Sabbath was set apart for, we know it is for rest. Jesus is that perfect rest we enter into when we are changed. Paul said,

***"do not let any man lord over you a Sabbath day, for some hold all days the same and some another".***

In this, we can see that we yield to the Holy Spirit to lead us to that rest.

Would you tell a man providing for his family that he needed to quit his job because he worked on a certain day? I hope not, for we are told to do everything as unto God. Taking care of your family, as well as being a good employee. Why do we want to cause division over a day as if we still trying to live by the law? James wrote that if we keep the whole law, yet stumble in a small area, we are judged by the weight of the entire law.

What more can I say, but to give you His word to reflect upon and hope He will give you a heart to understand it...

***"Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest. So there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God. For the one who has entered His rest has himself also rested from his works, as God did from His. For we who have believed enter that rest, just as He has said, "As I Swore In My Wrath, They Shall Not Enter My Rest," although His works were finished from the foundation of the world.***

*We live under the law of liberty to love God, serve one another and to carry our brother's burden.*

# The Gift of Love



I wrote this after watching a show on Animal Planet about who monks raised and trained dogs. They were talking about the love a dog gives in return to its master/mistress. This is not just true with dogs, but with children as well. We all know how children are always happy to see you, or hear your voice. They are completely reliant on you for everything. This started me thinking about why we don't have this kind of love towards God our Father, for He takes care of us in the exact same manner we do with a child.

When is the last time you searched for Him to hear His word, or smiled at Him as your baby smiled at you as it awakes from a nap? What is it in us that prevent us from loving Him with all our might? I hope you find the time to look at all the times “rock” is mentioned in the Bible and seek the meaning behind each.

The rock Moses struck to bring forth water was a representation of Jesus and the salvation we find in him. Will you willingly drink from it?
