But this is where some of the problems start to begin.

We earn our income, but then the government takes its' slice for Tax and National Insurance (in the UK) and for wherever you the reader lives, your respective government also delves into your pay-packet at the end of each month and removes a portion of your hard-earned money.

So, there you are, with slightly less than you hoped for in your pay-packet and now begins the never-ending struggle to meet the demands of your essential bills.

Your earned income, (wages), probably gets transferred directly in to your bank account. From there, your bills are paid, perhaps by direct debit or standing order.

For groceries and other small purchases, you no doubt use your debit card (bank card). If you’re concerned about people, the welfare of animals, the state of the planet and the environment and the future of the whole world, then, in other words you are caring! So, it doesn’t follow that you have to be religious to be caring.

Therefore, in this new money free world we would create, religion is going to take a back-seat.

Everyone has the right to believe in which ever god/religion they choose but, it will be kept private to their own home and can never be thrust upon anyone else.

As an example of the worse kind of religious zeal, power hungry greed and pomposity for instance, the wealth of the Catholic Church says it all; for here would be enough money to feed most of the poorest nations.

When you see religious persons wearing gold, ermine and other expensive finery, you might question their true ethical values.

Are they not putting their own comforts before the poor and destitute? Why do they need such comforts, when there are so many poor in the world?

If they truly have such a principled religion, can they not just as easily practise this in lesser garments? Or do they believe that their appearance is more important than the message they are trying to represent. And I don't just mean their individual appearance but how the Catholic Church is portrayed as being so opulent and powerful. The money part is speaking again and we are meant to feel that they have the power of insight because of it. But this is not so!

Any religion is only as powerful as the number of people who believe in it.

Money, fine clothes, opulent furnishings and magnificent buildings do not depict the religion, irrespective of which one it is; be it Christ, Buddha, Allah, the one God of the Jews or any other number of lesser known religions.

If any one person believes that there is something more to life and wishes to interpret this as a religion, then that is their right.

Yet why do they need this belief to be given authority by some ecclesiastical establishment. Do they not believe that the religion speaks for itself?

One of the many irritants I find in regard to any of the more well-known religions, is the constant placement of fear upon its followers, should they not maintain any of the depicted rituals. Some of these rules and rituals in regard to the allowance of being a believer are just not reasonable or ethical.

One has to ask, why any Deity would impose some of these but does it come from the Deity or is it just a rule imposed by man, to keep the followers dancing in circles to a totally different tune.

It ultimately means that the believer must dance attendance to these rules, if they wish to be the perfect follower.

But surely you should be asking yourself, what right anyone has, be it deity or (hu)(wo)man, to ask another to demean themselves in this fashion, to the humour of another.

If there is a God, no matter which religion he/she/it is related to, I certainly do not believe any deity worth anything, would have such a penchant for such barbaric practises.

What would be the point to them? What do any of them merit? If you really take a long hard look at some of these practises and I won't outline any one particular religion here, some of them are really quite perverse.

So, if you think that some Deity is worthy of being worshipped, yet you are willing to adhere to such practises, I question your mindset.

I see no reason why anyone would allow anybody to demean them in that way, certainly not under the auspices of religious fervour.

As I said, religion in the home is one thing but bringing it out to the world and dictating that other people should only believe in one or your religion, is not something we should allow for this new world. I would question why anyone needs such a prop to live by.

There is no reason not to be good and kind; you don't need any religion to tell you that or to qualify your actions if you follow that creed.

There is more harm done in the name of religion, than almost any other form. We are told we will go to hell if we don't believe this creed or that one; if we don't practise certain rituals or give up certain foods for specific periods.

What right does anyone have to impose this kind of fear technique on a susceptible congregation? Yet it goes on daily through-out all religious sects.

Why do people follow it?

Because they are too scared not to!

"Fear is the enemy of the susceptible -

- and the power of the perpetrator".

Take away that fear and the perpetrator loses his power.

Ecclesiastical establishments would lose all their money and power if people realised that it is possible to believe in a religion, without the need to have that belief qualified.

If the particular religion you practise gives you a happier life, then why would you need approval of some power hungry individuals? You are only feeding their iconic status; it has nothing to do with how you believe, nor will it make you a better follower of your religion.

If you need that sort of approval, then there is something wrong with your belief and I would suggest you take a much deeper look into why you need it.

For myself, after discarding the scare tactics of the Christian religion, I decided that I would investigate any and everything, before I hand over my mind and soul to another religious sect.

So far, I've yet to find one that doesn't try and contradict all others. Yet they all seem to be offering the same things but with different words.

Does this mean there is only one religion but with different names? Or, that there is no religion and we cannot hear the inner message for the fear.

But, for this new world, religion will not be the dominatrix that it has been in the past.

There will be no money or power hungry establishments feeding on the fear of the follower, just people believing in and doing good things.
